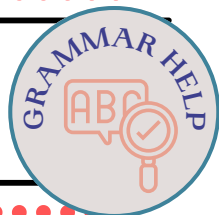
Prepositions are the words that express the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence.

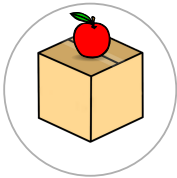
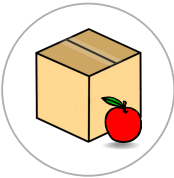
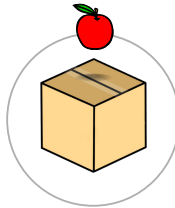
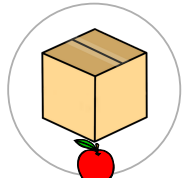
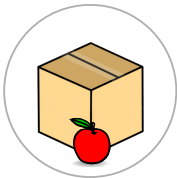
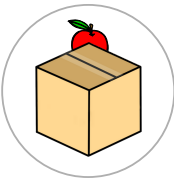
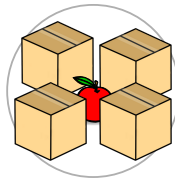
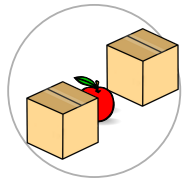
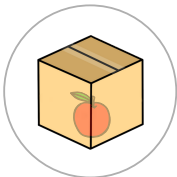
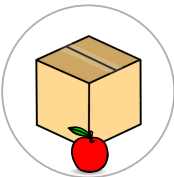
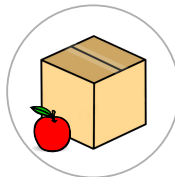
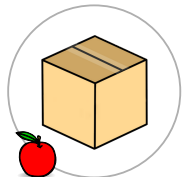
Prepositions

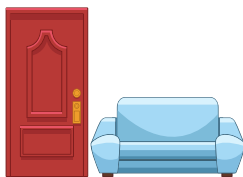

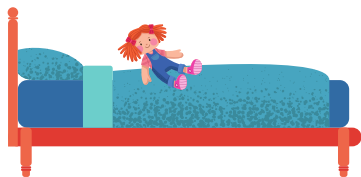

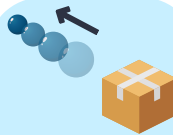

DIRECTION PREPOSITIONS

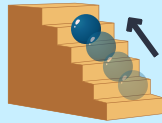
Direction prepositions indicate the direction of movement. They are used to describe movement from one place to another.

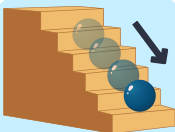

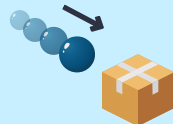

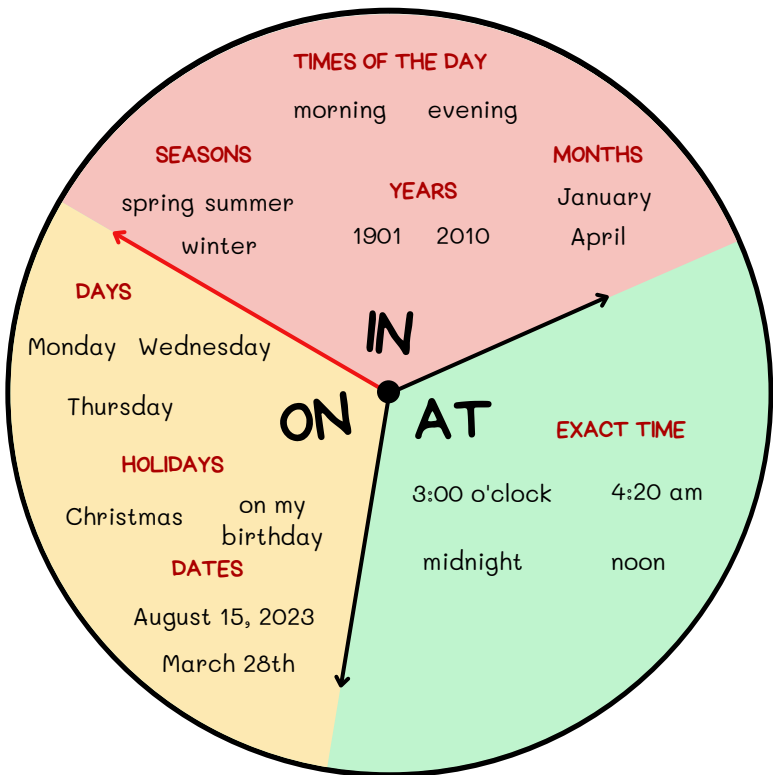

TIME PREPOSITIONS

Time prepositions indicate when something is happening. They are used to describe the time of day, days of the week, months of the year, and specific dates.



TIME PREPOSITIONS

At

Used to refer to a specific point in time.

I will meet you at 3 PM.

In

Used to indicate a period of time.

She was born in May.

On

Used to refer to a specific day or date.

The party is on Friday.

During

Used to describe an action that takes place within a specific period of time.

I fell asleep during the movie.

Before

Used to indicate that one event happens prior to another event

The party is on Friday.

After

Used to indicate that one event happens later than another event

The party is on Friday.

MANNER PREPOSITIONS

by

Used to indicate the method or means by which something is done

The letter was delivered by mail.

with

Used to indicate the tool, instrument, or material used to do an action.

She cuts vegetables with a knife.

in

Used to describe the way or manner in which something is done or performed.

The dancers moved in perfect harmony.

like

Used to indicate a similarity or a comparison between two things or actions.

He drives like a maniac.
