Interjections are short words or phrases that convey strong emotions or reactions. They are usually used in spoken language and help us express our feelings spontaneously.

EXPRESSIVE INTERJECTIONS

Expressive interjections are used to convey strong emotions or sensations, such as pain, surprise, or excitement. They often serve as an immediate reaction to something unexpected or impactful.

Ah

Denotes realization or understanding Ah! Now I understand the problem.

Oh

Expresses surprise, disappointment, or sudden realization
Oh! I forgot my wallet at home.

Ow

Indicates pain or discomfort Ow! I just stubbed my toe.

GREETING INTERJECTIONS

Greeting interjections are used to acknowledge someone's presence or initiate a conversation. They are a friendly and informal way of saying hello or addressing someone.

Hello

A polite and standard way of greeting someone

Hello, how are you today?

Hi

A casual and informal greeting, usually used among friends or acquaintances.

Hi, it's nice to see you again!

Hey

A more informal and laid-back greeting, often used to grab someone's attention.

Hey, wait up!

EXCLAMATORY INTERJECTIONS

Exclamatory interjections express strong emotions such as amazement, joy, or enthusiasm. They help emphasize a speaker's feelings or reactions to a particular situation or event.

Wow

Indicates surprise, amazement, or admiration

Wow! This cake is delicious!

Hurray

Expresses joy, victory, or celebration

Hurray! We won the match!

APPROVAL / AGREEMENT INTERJECTIONS

These interjections show agreement, affirmation, or support. They can be used to indicate that the speaker agrees with a statement or idea.

Yes

A standard way of expressing agreement or consent

Yes, I think that's a great idea.

Yeah

A casual and informal greeting, usually used among friends or acquaintances.

Yeah, let's go to the movies.

Okay

A more informal and laid-back greeting, often used to grab someone's attention.

Okay, I'll meet you there at 5 pm.

DISAPPROVAL / DENIAL INTERJECTIONS

Disapproval or denial interjections convey disagreement, rejection, or disapproval. They can be used to express a speaker's unwillingness or opposition to something.

No

A standard way of expressing disagreement or refusal.

No, I can't help you with that right now.

Never

Indicates strong refusal or denial.

I will never forgive him for what he did.
